

<u>EYFS Framework 2024 –</u> <u>'Positive Relationships' /</u> Review and Revision

One of the core principles of the revised EYFS framework September 2023 was to remove the burden of paperwork and record keeping that had arisen over recent years. Practitioners were spending too much time creating observations of children rather than interacting with the children themselves.

In the Moment Planning (ITMP) the ethos that Ide Hill pre-school follows - is an intuitive approach to EYFS with the core basis of the teaching being involved in the 'here and now' so each teachable moment can truly be used to the advantage of the child.

With children spending more time with their teachers – through an environment which is rich and exciting; the children are more likely to become more effective learners as they feel supported throughout the process. Reviewing the amount of paperwork and observations has meant that as a pre-school we are ensuring that what we are recording is significant and useful to future planning and assessments, allowing for **quality** rather than **quantity**.

School Readiness

If a child can hold a pencil. write their own name. count to 100, recognise all the colours & shapes. But doesn't know how to make friends. Manage their emotions and conflict resolution. To be independent & have self help skills. None of the other stuff matters.
