Important Update: New Ofsted Framework from 1st November

From 1st November 2025, a new Ofsted Education Inspection Framework will be in place for all early year's settings, including pre-schools like ours. This updated framework changes the way Ofsted inspects and reports on early years providers, with the aim of making inspections fairer, more transparent, and more focused on what matters most for children's learning and well-being.

What's changing?

- Instead of a single overall grade, settings will now receive a "report card" with grades across several key areas, such as safeguarding, inclusion, curriculum and teaching, achievement, behaviour and attitudes, children's welfare and well-being, and leadership.
- The new grading scale includes: Exceptional, Strong Standard, Expected Standard, Needs Attention, and Urgent Improvement.
- Safeguarding will be judged separately as either "met" or "not met."
- There is a greater focus on inclusion, leadership, and the well-being of both children and staff.
- Inspections will be more collaborative, with inspectors taking time to understand each setting's unique context and strengths.

New Jingle and Jive Sessions – Why They Matter

We were excited to introduce our new 'Jingle and Jive' sessions this term, and we're delighted to see how much the children are enjoying them! These lively sessions combine music, singing, and interactive movement, creating a fun and engaging environment for all.

But Jingle and Jive is more than just fun—it's an important part of your child's learning and development. Music and movement are closely linked to the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), supporting key areas such as:



- **Communication and Language:** Singing and rhymes help children develop listening skills, expand their vocabulary, and encourage expressive language.
- **Physical Development:** Dancing and movement activities improve coordination, balance, and gross motor skills.
- **Personal, Social, and Emotional Development:** Group music sessions build confidence, encourage cooperation, and help children express their feelings.
- **Creativity:** Exploring sounds, rhythms, and movement sparks imagination and creative thinking.

Through Jingle and Jive, children are not only having a wonderful time but also building important skills that support their overall growth and readiness for school.

Should your child experience vomiting or diarrhoea, we ask that they remain at home for a minimum of 48 hours after their most recent episode. This precaution helps to minimise the risk of spreading viruses and bugs within our setting.

Additionally, if your child develops a temperature or requires medication such as Calpol to manage their symptoms, please keep them at home until they are fully recovered. Your cooperation in following these measures is greatly appreciated and helps us maintain a safe and healthy environment for everyone.
